CHIEF MASTER SGT. MEREDITH C. CONN

Wisconsin Air National Guard

Chief Master Sgt. Meredith Cristine Conn is the Wisconsin Air National Guard command chief, assigned to Joint Force Headquarters in Madison, Wisconsin. She is the top Air National Guard senior enlisted advisor to the adjutant general on readiness, professional development, training and quality of life issues for Wisconsin's 2,200 Airmen. She has oversight of four geographically separated areas within the state and acts as liaison with the deputy adjutants general for Air and Army, the state command sergeant major, director of staff and other members.

Chief Conn attended basic military training at Lackland Air Force Base in Texas in February 1992. She attended Airman Leadership School at Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi in 1996. In 2002 she earned an associates degree



in applied science, transportation management, from Community College of the Air Force. In 2003 she earned a bachelors of science degree in elementary and middle level education from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. In 2006 she earned an associates degree in applied science, logistics management, from Community College of the Air Force. The same year she completed the Noncommissioned Officer Academy by correspondence. She received a graduate certificate of instructional design in 2014 from the University of Wisconsin-Stout. In 2015 she completed the Senior Noncommissioned Officer Academy at Maxwell Air Force Base, Gunter Annex, Alabama. In 2016 she completed the Human Resource Advisor Orientation Course at Buckley Air Force Base, Colorado, and Leadership Challenge Program I-Diversity Leadership at the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado. In 2018 she completed the Chief Master Sergeant Orientation Course at Joint Base Andrews, Maryland. In 2019 she completed the Senior Enlisted Joint PME I by correspondence, and the Chiefs Leadership Course at Maxwell Air Force Base.

Chief Conn entered the active duty Air Force in February 1992 in the transportation career field. She served in several capacities in that career field at Beale Air Force Base, California, Andersen Air Force Base, Guam, and Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi. She separated honorably as a staff sergeant to pursue a career in education. While pursuing her bachelor's degree, she transferred to the Air National Guard at Volk Field as a drill status Guardsman in the Supply Career field. Later, in 2003, she transferred to the Air Force Reserves as an individualized mobility augmentee at Ramstein Air Base, Germany and returned to the Wisconsin Air National Guard in 2004. In 2008, as a senior master sergeant, Conn was hired as an Active Guard Reserve operations manager in the Civil Engineering Squadron at Volk Field. Chief Conn has served in multiple leadership capacities, to include program manager for the Wisconsin State Enlisted Development Program and Volk Field's first human resource advisor.

During her time as a drill status Guardsman, Chief Conn worked as a third-grade teacher at Dexheim Army Post in Germany and taught middle school English at Columbus Catholic in Marshfield, Wisconsin. Prior to assuming her current position, Chief Conn was the senior enlisted advisor to the commander at Volk Field Air National Guard Base.

Chief Conn's military awards include the Air Force Meritorious Service Medal, the Air Force Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster, and the Air Force Achievement Medal with three oak leaf clusters.

Chief Conn lives in Holmen, Wisconsin.

Employers can now defer a portion of payroll tax withholdings for their employees who make less than \$4,000 bi-weekly from September 1 — December 31, 2020 — which is supposed to provide temporary financial relief to working families during the pandemic. And since Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) takes care of all of those payroll issues, you may not think twice about the extra money in your paycheck.

But the extra money you'll see in your paycheck? It all comes due in 2021. While employers have been given the opportunity to opt out of the program, the federal government is expected to participate. That means that every service member from active duty, Guard, and Reserves — will have their payroll taxes deferred. Service members earning less than \$8,666.66 in monthly basic pay will have their Social Security tax, labeled "FICA-SOC SECURITY" on your Leave and Earnings Statement (LES), deferred. Again — not waved, forgiven, or reimbursed — just deferred.

All military pay will be affected, and there's no opportunity to opt out of the program.

While a payroll tax deferral means more take-home pay in the short-term, the long-term repercussions are still unclear.

While the President's Order can defer the tax, he alone cannot forgive it. President Trump's order directs the Secretary of Treasury to *pursue legislative action to forgive the deferred taxes* — a long Congressional process not likely to happen in remaining months of 2020.

If Congress does not act to forgive the deferred taxes, you will have to pay them back, and on the government's timeline, meaning the deferred taxes will be taken directly out of service members' paychecks — in addition to the usual amount of payroll taxes.

Here are a couple things you can do to prepare:

1. Make sure you know exactly how much money is deducted every month from your

paycheck for social security. (remember that "FICA-SOC SECURITY" line)

2. In paychecks received from mid-September through the end of the year, check to

see exactly how much *wasn't* taken out — and put that money aside if you can. The more you save now, the less it will hurt when it's time to pay the deferred money back.

Sometimes there needs to be a new directive if there is nothing available as a proper guide.

You need to do some digging to find out certain facts to see what is happening now. Describe how the current directive, if there is one, how it is not doing what it is supposed to do, along with providing some examples. Propose how your new suggestion, or the current directive should be changed, providing benefits if any, with the adoption of the change. This is the resolution process.

How TRICARE For Life Eligibility, Enrollment Works

Are you wondering what the <u>TRICARE For Life</u> (TFL) program is and whether you're eligible? TFL is Medicare-wraparound coverage for TRICARE beneficiaries who have Medicare Part A and Part B. This is regardless of your age or where you live. It provides comprehensive health care coverage. With TFL, you also get prescription coverage under the <u>TRICARE Pharmacy Program</u>.

Am I eligible for TFL?

To be eligible for TFL, you must first show that you're eligible for TRICARE in the <u>Defense Enrollment</u> <u>Eligibility Reporting System</u> (DEERS). That's why it's important to keep your DEERS information current. "Accurate information in DEERS is key," said Anne Breslin, TRICARE For Life program manager at the Defense Health Agency. "It'll help you get effective and timely delivery of your TFL benefits." Medicare eligibility is the second piece of being eligible for TFL. Medicare is a federal entitlement health insurance program that provides hospital insurance (Medicare Part A) and medical insurance (Medicare Part B) for people:

- Age 65 or older
- Under age 65 with certain disabilities
- Any age with end-stage renal disease

Your birth date determines when you become <u>eligible for Medicare</u> based on reaching age 65. It also determines when you should sign up for both Medicare Part A and Part B. Signing up on time will help you avoid a break in TRICARE coverage and get your TFL coverage. If your birthday falls on the first day of the month, you become eligible for Medicare on the first day of the month before you turn age 65. If your birthday falls after the first day of the month, you become eligible for Medicare on the first day of the month before you turn age 65. If your birthday falls after the first day of the month, you become eligible for Medicare on the first day of the month you turn age 65. Five months before you turn age 65, you'll get a notification from the Defense Manpower Data Center reminding you to sign up for Medicare. Your notice will be sent to your email address on your DEERS record, if you've opted for electronic communication.

How do I enroll in TFL?

There are no enrollment forms for you to submit or paperwork to complete. If you already show as eligible for TRICARE in DEERS, are entitled to Medicare Part A, and have Medicare Part B, you're covered under TFL. Your TFL coverage starts the first day you have both Medicare Part A and Part B.

There are also no TFL enrollment fees. But you must continue to be eligible for TRICARE and <u>pay</u> <u>Medicare Part B premiums</u> to remain eligible for TFL benefits. Once you have TFL, you're no longer eligible for <u>TRICARE Prime</u>, unless you're under the age of 65.

Now that you understand TFL eligibility including Medicare enrollment, you may be wondering if other members of your family can have TFL coverage. Each individual must be eligible for Medicare in order to have TFL coverage. This is regardless of whether you're the sponsor or family member.

"TRICARE For Life is an individual entitlement," said Breslin. "That means coverage is only for the Medicare and TRICARE eligible beneficiary, and not for family members who aren't eligible for Medicare." Doing so will help you make informed choices and take command of your health.
