**Business Casual** is authorized for all attendees, including those in a military duty status or anyone in a paid duty status for Saturday Professional Development and meetings.

## **BUSINESS CASUAL DO'S AND DONT'S**

### DO'S

- Tops: Blouse, Collared shirts, Polos, Sweaters (includes half-zip sweater), Vests
- Bottoms: Dress slacks, pants, and skirts
- (Optional) Jackets and Neckties



### DONT'S

- Tops: Printed t-shirts, hoodies, midriff-baring ensemble, crop tops, anything low-cut
- Bottoms: Blue jeans
- Athletic wear, e.g. sweatpants, shirts, or other exercise-related clothing
- Pajama or pajama-like outfits, transparent top/bottom
- Footwear: Athletic Shoes
- Accessories: Outlandish or excessive amounts of jewelry





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## SMART CASUAL & WHY IT'S A DON'T

Smart Casual is a **style halfway between formal and casual.** Therefore, it is neither an elegant look with a jacket and necktie, nor an overly sporty outfit with sneakers, t-shirt and jeans. Smart Casual stands for 'simple, but elegant'.



#### MORE CASUAL

- · Casual jackets ok
- · Solid t-shirts ok
- · Solid denim ok
- · Clean sneakers ok

#### A LITTLE BIT OF BOTH

- · Sports jacket enouraged
- · Matching suits in special occasions
- Ties optional
- · Polos ok
- · Denim ok (sometimes only on Fridays)

#### MORE BUSINESS

- Matching suit ok, ties encouraged
- Sports coats with pants ok
- No denim
- No sneakers

### **BUSINESS ATTIRE, SEMIFORMAL, MILITARY UNIFORM**

Business Attire is a step up from Business
 Casual. Highly recommend Jackets and Neckties.

• Semiformal/Cocktail: A more relaxed look than what's required at a formal, black-tie event. Wear something nice, no need to purchase an evening gown or rent a tux. Instead wear a cocktail dress, dressy jumpsuits, rompers, & separates; or a suit or tailored pieces. This includes a shirt, chinos or slacks, a sports jacket or blazer, and dress shoes.

• Military Uniform: those wishing to wear military uniform (ASU/Class A/Mess Dress) are authorized to do so, yet not required.



## **CASUAL CIVILIAN & SPORTS TEAM THEME**

 Casual Civilian: Safe, decent, neat, and clean.
 Civilian clothing will be worn in good taste, conservative, and set an example of neatness with your appearance.

• Sports Team Theme: Wear a jersey, shirt, or other attire to show us who you root for.
