

## **Company Grade Officer and Enlisted Professional Development Training**



The 115<sup>th</sup> Fighter Wing and Volk Field ANGB are co-hosting the 2025 Wisconsin National Guard State Conference at the DoubleTree Hotel, 4402 E. Washington Avenue, Madison, WI, on 25-27 April. This event is co-sponsored by the Wisconsin National Guard Association (WINGA) and the Wisconsin National Guard Enlisted Association (WNGEA). Several professional speakers have been invited to the conference to share their expertise on topics to improve and enhance leadership, teamwork, legislative awareness, and mentorship skills. The following is a summary of our professional development speakers and their qualifications.



Major General Paul D. Rogers is the Adjutant General of the Michigan National Guard and serves as the Director of the Michigan Department of Military and Veterans Affairs. He commands and directs more than 150 units that comprise the Michigan National Guard (approximately 10,500 soldiers and airmen) and oversees the employment of more than 700 State and 300 Federal employees that make up the department's branch operations which include Michigan Veterans Homes, Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency, State Operations and the Michigan Youth Challenge Academy. MG Rogers received his commission

through the Reserve Officer Training Corps as a graduate from Michigan Technological University with a degree in Mechanical Engineering and a Doctor of Philosophy in Mechanical Engineering. Prior to being selected as the Michigan Adjutant General, MG Rogers served as Commander of the 177<sup>th</sup> Regional Training Institute, Deputy Commanding General of the 46<sup>th</sup> Military Police Command, and Commander of the 507<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion during Operation Iraqi Freedom. MG Rogers also served as Deputy Commander, US Army Tank Automotive and Armaments Command. During this assignment, Dr. Rogers was responsible for implementing comprehensive and cohesive strategy providing acquisition, logistics and sustainment support for over 3,000 soldiers that operated at ten major U.S. Army installations, 70 worldwide locations, and base operations at three depots and two arsenals. Dr. Rogers was directly accountable for an annual budget of \$4.7B and an additional \$2B in foreign military sales. Dr. Rogers supervised a workforce of over 18,800 combined military and civilian employees. His major decorations include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, and Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf clusters. In 2024, MG Rogers was elected to the position of NGAUS Chairman of the Board.



CSM (Ret) Robert Sweeney currently serves as the President of the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS) and Executive Director of the Washington National Guard Association. CSM Sweeney previously served as Senior Enlisted Leader of the 205<sup>th</sup> Leadership Regiment covering 15 regional NCOES Schools, and CSM of the 81<sup>st</sup> Heavy Brigade Combat Team during combat operations in Ramadi, Iraq. He is Past President

of the National Guard Executive Directors Association (NGEDA). Mr. Sweeney will provide a briefing on pending legislative initiatives to benefit the National Guard.
